- I. **Vendor Registration:** Unless stated elsewhere in this document, vendor must register by requesting an 'On-boarding Invitation' via email addressed to mcweisen@rivco.org (if not already registered)
- II. **Pricing/Terms/Tax:** All pricing shall be quoted both F.O.B. shipping point and F.O.B. destination, (e.g., cash terms less than 20 days should be considered net) excluding applicable tax. The Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District (District) pays California Sales Tax and is exempt from federal excise tax. Each item shall be bid separately the event of an extension error, the unit price shall prevail.
- III. **Period of Firm Pricing:** Unless stated otherwise elsewhere in this document, prices shall be firm for 365 days after the closing date.
- IV. **Recycled Material:** Wherever possible, the District is looking for items made from, or containing in part, recycled material. Respondents are encouraged to bid items containing recycled material as an alternative for the items specified; however, the District reserves the right to reject those alternatives as non-responsive.
- V. **Method of Award:** The District reserves the right to reject any or all offers, to waive any discrepancy or technicality and to split or make the award in any manner determined by the District to be most advantageous to the District. The District recognizes that prices are only one of several criteria to be used in judging an offer and the District is not legally bound to accept the lowest offer.
- VI. **Other Terms and Conditions:** The terms and conditions as indicated in this document and/or attached are hereby included with full force and like effect as if set forth herein. Copies of the application Terms and Conditions may be obtained by visiting the County's website at www.purchasing.co.riverside.ca.us or contact Riverside County Purchasing at 951.955.4937 and request a copy to be faxed or mailed to you.
- VII. **Return of Bid/Closing Date/Return to:** The bid response shall be delivered to Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District, 1995 Market Street, Riverside, Ca 92501 by 1:30 p.m. on the closing date listed above. Bid responses not received by the District by the closing date and time indicated above will not be accepted. The closing date and time and the R.F.P. number referenced above shall appear on the outside of the sealed envelope. A duly executed copy of the signature page of this bid document must accompany your response. The District will not be responsible for and will not except late bids due to delayed mail delivery or courier services.
- VIII. **Auditing:** The Consultant agrees that Riverside County, the State of California, the Federal government, or designated representatives shall have the right to review and copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this contract. Consultant agrees to maintain such records for a possible audit for a minimum of (3) years after final payment, or until closure of pending matter unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated. Consultant agrees to allow auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and allow interviews of any employees or others who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, the Consultant agrees to include a similar right of Riverside County, the State of California, or the Federal government to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to the performance of this contract.
- IX. **Local Preference:** The District complies with a local preference program adopted by the County of Riverside for those Respondents located within the geographical boundaries of Riverside County. A five percent (5%) price preference may be applied to the total bid price during evaluation of the bid responses. To qualify as a local business, the business must have fixed offices within the geographical boundaries of Riverside County and must credit all sales taxes paid resulting from this RFQ/P to that Riverside County location. To qualify for local preference, Respondent must include a copy of a Riverside Business Tax License that supports the local preference status and complete Form 116-260 Local Business Qualification Affidavit.
- X. **Procurement Preference Programs (P3)** The County of Riverside has implemented a Procurement Preference Programs. Where applicable, a five percent (5%) preference shall be applied to the total bid price of all quotes/bids/proposals received by the County from a Service-Disabled Veteran, Veteran, National Guard and Federal Reserve Veteran, Active Member of the U.S. Armed Forces, National Guard or Federal Reservist - Owned Businesses and for Veteran-Qualified Businesses. The preference program also provides for a 5% match for Local or Small Businesses. A five percent (5%) price preference shall be applied to the total bid price during evaluation of the bid responses. If the overall low responsible and responsive business is a non- local or small business vendor, the local or small business vendor who is within five percent (5%) of that overall low bidder may, where applicable, be offered the opportunity to match the overall low bidder's price and will receive the award. Businesses are to provide proof of designation as identified in the Board Policy B-34 (<https://www.rivcocob.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/06/POLICY-B34.Revised.05-21-19.pdf>) and shall submit the required documentation with their bid submittal along with the appropriate affidavit. If the Bidder fails to provide the required documents, the Bidder may be disqualified from obtaining the preference. It is the sole responsibility of the Bidder to provide the required documentation. Application of preferences may be waived if funding sources disallow it. Additional information about the application of preferences can be found in Board Policy B-34 (<https://www.rivcocob.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/06/POLICY-B34.Revised.05-21-19.pdf>). **Federal Exclusion List** if the award is federal or State funded, the potential bidder must go to the following website (<https://www.sam.gov/portal/public/SAM>) and submit a printout with their proposal that verifies that the contractor is not listed on the Excluded Parties Listing System (EPLS) (Executive Order 12549, 7 CFR Part 3017, 45 CFR Part 76, and 44 CFR Part 17). 1.0 DEFINITIONS

Wherever these words occur in this RFP, they shall have the following meaning:

- A. "Addendum" shall mean an amendment or modification to the RFP.
- B. "Bid" shall mean the proposal submitted by Respondents on the Bid Form consistent with the Instructions to Respondents, to complete the Work for a specified sum of money and within a specified period of time.
- C. "Consultant" shall mean the successful Respondent to this RFP who enters into a written Contract with Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.
- D. "Contract" shall mean the written agreement resulting from this RFP executed by Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District and Consultant.
- E. "District" shall mean Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District.
- F. "Joint Venture" shall mean an association of two or more persons or firms engaged in the cooperative effort of providing services described in the Scope of Services for which a proposal is being submitted.
- G. "NPDES" shall mean National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System.
- H. "Project" shall refer to benefit assessment services for Fiscal Years, 2025-2026, 2026-2027, 2027-2028, 2028-2029, and 2029-2030.
- I. "Proposal" is used interchangeably with "Bid."
- J. "Respondents" shall mean an individual, firm, partnership, corporation or joint venture making a proposal or response to the District's Request for Proposal.
- K. "RFP" shall mean Request for Proposal.
- L. "Should", "desirable", or "ask" means a requirement having a significant degree of importance to the objectives of the RFP.
- M. "Subcontractor/Subconsultant" shall mean any person, firm, or corporation performing work or providing service for the Respondents in support of the Scope of Services for an agreement.
- N. "Will", "shall", "must", "mandatory" or "required" means a requirement that must be met in order for a proposal to receive consideration.

2.0 PURPOSE/BACKGROUND

PURPOSE

- 2.1 The Riverside County Flood Control and Water Conservation District is requesting proposals from qualified Respondents to provide annual administration of its NPDES Assessment Program for the Last Quarter of Fiscal Year 24/25 (April 1 - June 30, 2025) and, Fiscal Years, 2025-2026, 2026-2027, 2027-2028, 2028-2029, and 2029-2030.

BACKGROUND

2.2 The District has and will continue to establish assessment districts pursuant to the Municipal Improvement Act of 1913 (Streets and Highways Code Sections 10000, et. seq.), improvement districts pursuant to the Benefit Assessment Act of 1982 (California Government Code Sections 54703, et. seq.) and/or benefit assessment districts pursuant to the District Act. (Chapter 48 of the Appendix of California Water Code) and to sell and issue bonds pursuant to the Improvement Bond Act of 1915 (Streets and Highways Coded Sections 8500, et. seq.) and the District Act.

Assessment districts, improvement districts, benefit assessment districts and benefit assessment programs for Santa Ana, Santa Margarita and Whitewater Watersheds require administrative services for the calculation, apportionment and collection of assessments levied in districts and watersheds.

3.0 SCOPE OF SERVICE

3.1 SCOPE OF SERVICES / GENERAL

Scope of services generally applicable to the NPDES Programs Benefit Assessment Program.

3.1.1 TASK 1: ANNUAL ASSESSMENT LISTING

Prepare annual special assessment listing by parcel in tape or other format acceptable to the Riverside County Auditor-Controller. The debt service schedule will be prepared on the basis of the configuration of the lands as they exist on the first day of January in the year the schedule is prepared.

3.1.2 TASK 2: PREPARE ASSESSMENT APPORTIONMENTS

Prepare assessment apportionments, including preparation of and recording of the amended assessment diagram, apportionment of assessment to divided parcels, preparation and mailing of Notice of Original Bond Buyer, and amendment of the debt service roll.

3.1.3 TASK 3: PREPARE REPORTS OF DELINQUENCIES

Check for and prepare reports of delinquencies in payment of taxes for the properties affected by the bond debt service schedule(s) at appropriate intervals as requested by the District. Assist in letter preparation to property owners regarding delinquencies and coordinate judicial foreclosure proceedings with special counsel (Optional – requires District Approval).

3.1.4 TASK 4: PUBLIC INFORMATION AND DISCLOSURE REPORTING

Prepare a public information report setting forth the improvements for which the assessment was levied and the method used in apportioning the costs of the improvements to the lands within the District or watershed area (optional but recommended).

3.1.5 TASK 6: PROPERTY OWNER INFORMATION

Provide property owners with information relating to special assessment proceedings and costs which were assessed to their lands.

3.1.6 TASK 7: ADDRESS VERIFICATION & RETURNED HANDBILL PROCESSING

Review and process returned handbills to ensure accurate property owner notification. Identify and verify updated mailing addresses using County Assessor records, utility billing databases, and/or third-party address verification services. Provide a summary report of address updates and unresolved returns to the District. Reissue handbills as necessary to meet required noticing deadlines and maintain compliance with assessment notification requirements.

3.1.7 TASK 9: OTHER TASKS

Perform such other tasks in relation to special assessment proceedings as may be requested by the District.

3.1.8 TASK 10: PROJECT-RELATED SERVICES NOT LISTED

Perform services related to the project, which are not listed herein upon request by the Chief of Watershed Protection or designee.

3.2 SCOPE OF SERVICES / NPDES

Scope of services for the NPDES Benefit Assessment Program – Santa Ana, Santa Margarita, and Whitewater Watershed Areas.

3.2.1 TASK 11: DATA REVIEW

Collect and review data germane to the annual levy of the District including, but not limited to:

- Prior years' Engineer's Reports.
- Prior years' resolutions.
- Prior years' benefit assessment units (BAU's).
- Current year's budget.
- List of new parcels.
- Changes in land use classification for assignment of BAU; and
- Field check (if necessary).

3.2.2 TASK 12: COORDINATION WITH DISTRICT STAFF

Meet with District staff to obtain and discuss complaints and corrections received from prior year. This information will be compared to the information collected in Data Review. Determine a schedule to meet necessary time frames for preparation of the Forms 11, Resolutions, Engineer's Reports, Board Meeting, and Public Hearing. *Please note that a meeting will need to be held in the last quarter Fiscal 24/25 to kick off the FY 25/26 program year, an estimated cost should be included in the proposals.

3.2.3 TASK 13: RECOMMEND BENEFIT ASSESSMENTS

Prepare spreads based on Tasks 1 and 2 to determine the appropriate benefit assessment units per Watershed Area. Coordinate a meeting with District staff to confirm the analysis and to determine the agreed upon Benefit Assessment Unit (BAU) cost.

3.2.4 TASK 14: PROVIDE DATA IN COMPATIBLE FORMAT

Upon determination of format needs, provide data in a compatible format for use appropriate by District staff (if necessary). At minimum, District staff usually requests BAU counts by municipal jurisdiction.

3.2.5 TASK 15: PREPARATION OF THE ANNUAL ENGINEER'S REPORT

Prepare the Engineer's Reports including the assessment roll for the current Fiscal Year for District staff and County Counsel review and approval.

3.2.6 TASK 16: REPORT FILING AND NOTICING

Upon approval of each preliminary Engineer's Report and Notice of Public Hearing, file with the necessary designated posting locations as determined by the District.

3.2.7 TASK 17: PUBLIC SERVICE/INFORMATION

At the public hearing, be available to respond to property owners' concerns about the Watershed Areas. Also be available to make adjustments to assessment spreads necessary or as directed by the District staff.

3.2.8 TASK 18: ANNUAL LEVY SUBMITTAL

Submit the Annual Levy to the Riverside County Auditor-Controller.

3.2.9 TASK 19: MAINTAIN DELINQUENCY

Receive from the Riverside County Auditor-Controller the current delinquencies within each year and establish and maintain a delinquency database, if necessary, on behalf of the District.

4.0 WORK PRODUCT

- 4.1 All work papers prepared in connection with the above service will remain the property of the successful Respondent; however, all reports rendered to the District are the exclusive property of the District and subject to its use and control.
- 4.2 Respondents shall include in the bid a sufficient sum to cover all items, including labor, equipment and materials that are implied or required to complete the project or work. Errors or omissions in the contract document will not serve as an excuse for additional payment. Respondents will not be paid for any abatement completed by their own error, or errors of their employees.

6.0 PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

This agreement shall be effective upon signature of both parties and continues in effect through August 30, 2030 (Covers the NPDES Assessment Program planning in the Last Quarter of Fiscal Year 24/25, April 1 -June 30, 2025), and Fiscal Years, 25-26, 26-27, 27-28, 28-29, and 29-30) unless terminated earlier. CONTRACTOR shall commence performance upon signature of this Agreement by both parties and shall diligently and continuously perform thereafter. The Riverside County Board of Supervisors is the only authority that may obligate the County for a non-cancelable multi-year agreement.

7.0 PROPOSAL SUBMITTAL

PACKAGING

7.1 Proposals shall be submitted In Adobe Acrobat PDF format, on a single flash drive. Respondent's name and address shall appear in the upper left-hand corner of the package. All proposals shall be identified with "RFP FCARC 00191/Respondent Proposal" legibly written on the outside of the package(s).

SUBMITTAL

- 7.2 All proposals shall be signed by an authorized agent. Consultant shall submit a proposal package consisting of:

- 7.3 **In Person Delivery:** All proposals delivered in person or by courier must have the receptionist at the front desk date and time stamp all proposals upon receipt. Respondents or courier will be given a copy of the receipt for their records. Proposals received after the stated time and date will be considered late and will be returned.
- 7.4 **Standard Mail:** Late proposals will not be accepted. Postmarks **will not** be accepted in lieu of this requirement. Proposals received after March 11, 2025 at 1:30 p.m. will be considered late and will be returned.
- 7.5 The District will not be responsible for submittals that are delinquent, lost, incorrectly marked, sent to an address other than that given herein, or sent by mail or courier service and not signed for by the District. Proposals received at any other County office will not be accepted. Faxed or emailed proposals will not be accepted.

8.0 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

Procedures for Submitting Proposals

- 8.1 Respondents are encouraged to carefully review this RFP in its entirety prior to preparation of the proposals. All proposals must be submitted in accordance with the standards and specifications contained within this RFP and must contain a cover page with a Statement of Compliance and Minimum Requirements to meet the requirements specified.
- 8.2 The cover page of a responsive bid must be signed appropriately and completed with the Date, Firm Name, and Name and Title of a Firm Officer/Owner authorized to sign on behalf of the Firm (Page 4 of this RFP).
- 8.3 The District reserves the right to waive, at its discretion, any irregularity that the District deems reasonably correctable or otherwise not warranting rejection of the proposal.
- 8.4 The District reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted, and to request additional information from any Respondent.
- 8.5 The District reserves the right to withdraw the RFP, to reject a specific proposal for noncompliance within the RFP provisions, or not award a contract at any time because of unforeseen circumstances or if it is determined to be in the best interest of the District.
- 8.6 The District shall not pay any costs incurred or associated in the preparation of this or any proposal or for participation in the procurement process.
- 8.7 Any Respondent who wishes to make modifications to a proposal already received by the District must withdraw his/her proposal in order to make the modifications. All modifications must be made in ink, properly initialed by the Respondent's authorized representative, executed and submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions of this solicitation. It is the responsibility of the Respondent to ensure that modified proposals are resubmitted before the RFP submitted deadline.
- 8.8 Respondents may withdraw their proposals at any time prior to the due date and time by submitting notification of withdraws signed by the Respondent's authorized agent. Proposals cannot be changed or modified after the date and time designated for receipt.
- 8.9 Proposals must be typed uniformly on letter size (8 ½" x 11"), single or double-sided, each section clearly titled, with tabs A-N, and each page clearly and consecutively numbered. Proposals must be clean and suitable for printing and copying. Proposals must be specific unto themselves. For example, "*See Enclosed Manual*" will not be considered an acceptable proposal. **Receipt of all addendums, if any, must be acknowledged in the proposal.** (*Refer to Section 9.2, Subsection A of RFP.*)
- 8.10 The proposal shall be concise and to the point. A letter format in sufficient detail to allow thorough evaluation and analysis is required.

- 8.11 A proposal may be considered non-responsive if conditional, incomplete or if it contains alternations of form, additions not called for or other irregularities that may constitute a material change to the proposal.

9.0 REQUIRED FORMAT OF PROPOSALS

- 9.1 Proposals must be prepared simply and economically, providing a straightforward, concise description of methodology and approach to satisfy the requirements of this RFP. Emphasis should be on completeness and clarity of content with sufficient detail to allow for accurate evaluation and comparative analysis. The information required below will be used to evaluate the Respondent's proposal based on the criteria outlined in Section 11. Respondents may be deemed non-responsive if they do not respond to all Sections, A through N.

- 9.2 Each proposal shall be organized in separate sections tabbed with corresponding letters and related headings in the order presented below:

- L. Business Outreach Program Compliance (*If applicable, include Exhibit D*)
- M. Veteran Active Duty and/or National Guard Business Affidavit (*Refer to if applicable include Exhibit E*)
- N. Statement of Compliance (Include Exhibit F)

A. Executive Summary Letter, Proposal Cover Page, and all Addendums (if any)

The Executive Summary Letter shall be a brief formal letter from Respondent that provides information regarding the firm and its ability to perform the requirements of this RFP. This letter must include the following information: Company Name, Address, Contact Person, Telephone Number and Email Address.

The Proposal Cover Page (Page 4 of this RFP) must be signed by an authorized representative. Signature by an authorized representative of the firm on the proposal cover page shall constitute a warranty. The falsity of which shall entitle the District to pursue any remedy authorized by law, which shall include the right, at the option of the District, of declaring any contract made as a result thereof to be void.

All Addendums to the proposal must be signed by an authorized representative and included in this section.

B. Table of Contents

This section must contain a comprehensive table of contents that identifies material by Sections A-N (in order listed above) and by sequential page numbers.

C. Validity of Proposal

Responses to this RFP should be valid for a minimum of twelve (12) months. Submissions not valid for at least twelve (12) months must state the length of time for which the submitted proposal shall remain valid.

D. Statement of Compliance (Include Exhibit F)

Respondents shall include in this section either a statement of compliance with all parts of this solicitation (terms and conditions, scope of services, sample agreement, etc.) or a list of exceptions. The list of exceptions must include: suggested rewording/changes, reasons for submitting the proposed exception and any impact the proposed exception may have on the services to be provided.

E. Firm Experience

This section of the proposal is designed to establish the Respondent as an entity with the ability and experience to operate the program as specified in the RFP. The following information must be provided:

1. Business name and legal business status (i.e., partnership, corporation, etc.).
2. Proof of nonprofit status, if applicable.
3. Company overview of services or activities performed, including:
 - The history of the firm;
 - The number of years in business under the present business name, as well as prior business names;
 - The number of years of experience providing the proposed, equivalent or related services;
 - Company size – number of staff and client base;
 - Location of the office from which the work under this contract will be provided and the staff allocation at the office.
4. Whether the Respondent holds controlling or financial interests in any other organization or is owned or controlled by any other person or organization. If none, that must be stated.
5. Firm Experience
 - a. Auditing financial statements in compliance with GAAP and GASB pronouncements, the auditing standards accepted in the United States and the standards contained in the Government Auditing Standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.
 - b. Familiarity with District manuals and standards.
 - c. Working relationship and willingness to respond to District requirements.

F. Project Team

Respondents shall provide the following information relevant to the Project Team that will be assigned to this project:

- Company hierarchy (President, Vice President, Company Officers, etc.) and organization chart. Organizational chart and staffing plan must identify key personnel and related support staff (including subconsultants) that will perform and/or assist with the required services and deliverables. Job classifications shall be defined for all key personnel and support staff.
- Listing with job titles and resumes of key personnel that will perform the requested services. Resumes shall highlight title, education, licenses (issue and expiration dates), similar project experience within last 5 years and other qualifications for the service described in this RFP.
- Resource allocation table that identifies the individual classifications (prime and subconsultants) that will be performing the requested services and deliverables.

G. References with demonstrated success with similar work to the Scope of Work

Respondent shall:

- Cite all projects Respondent has worked on within the last three (3) years that are most relevant in size and scope to the services requested in this solicitation. For each, Respondent shall provide the project title, a narrative/brief description and indicate its firm's role (i.e., lead firm, support role, etc.). Respondent shall also describe the final project and the benefit realized by the client as a result of this work. Most current projects shall be listed first. All other pertinent information shall be provided including, but not limited to:
 1. Client business name and address;
 2. Client personnel name, title, telephone and email address (PLEASE COMPLETE);
 3. Project schedule and cost;
 4. Names of personnel from Respondent's team that participated on the above project and their specific role.

- Respondent shall choose three (3) projects from those cited above that best demonstrate the firm's qualifications and provide a detailed description of each. Provide the project schedule for each project. H. Technical Approach and Methodology

Based on your firm's similar past experience provide a detailed work plan describing the approach and procedures that will be used to perform the requested Scope of Services. This work plan shall follow the format outlined in the Scope of Services. Respondent is encouraged to identify and recommend any improvements/enhancements for the proposed service, as well as highlight other issues Respondent deems prudent. I. Cost Proposal (Include Exhibit B)

Based on its understanding and recommendations, Respondent shall submit a fixed-price cost proposal reflecting a bottom-line price to deliver all the services requested under this solicitation. Respondent shall provide sufficient detail/description in its cost proposal for the District to evaluate the overall quality of the proposed service. Respondent's cost proposal will be reviewed for:

- Competitiveness and reasonableness of costs.
- Complete and detailed costs, including indirect costs.

Respondent shall utilize Exhibit B to identify the individual classifications (prime and subcontractors/subconsultants) that will be performing the requested services. Hours necessary to complete each task/subtask and hourly rates shall be clearly defined for each classification.

J. Financial Information

Respondent must submit financial statements (balance sheet and income statement) for its business that are dated no more than twelve (12) months prior to the date of the proposal submission and cover a period of at least one (1) year, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. These statements should clearly identify the financial status and condition of the Respondent's entire business entity. **Please place in a separate envelope and mark "Confidential" if your firm requires this to be kept confidential.** Audited financial statements are preferred but not required, and an independent credit rating would be most advantageous.

K. Conflict of Interest (Include Exhibit C)

L. Procurement Preference Programs (P3) (If applicable, include Exhibit D & E)

The District complies the preference programs adopted by the County of Riverside. Where applicable, a five percent (5%) preference shall be applied to the total bid price of all quotes/bids/proposals received by the County from a Service-Disabled Veteran, Veteran, National Guard and Federal Reserve Veteran, Active Member of the U.S. Armed Forces, National Guard or Federal Reservist - Owned Businesses and for Veteran-Qualified Businesses. The preference program also provides for a 5% match for Local or Small Businesses. A five percent (5%) price preference shall be applied to the total bid price during evaluation of the bid responses. If the overall low responsible and responsive business is a non- local or small business vendor, the local or small business vendor who is within five percent (5%) of that overall low bidder may, where applicable, be offered the opportunity to match the overall low bidder's price and will receive the award. Businesses are to provide proof of designation as identified in the Board Policy B-34 (<https://www.rivcocob.org/wp-content/uploads/2019/06/POLICY-B34.Revised.05-21-19.pdf>) and shall submit the required documentation with their bid submittal along with the appropriate affidavit. If the Bidder fails to provide the required documents, the Bidder may be disqualified from obtaining the preference. It is the sole responsibility of the Bidder to provide the required documentation. Application of preferences may be waived if funding sources disallow it. Additional information about the application of preferences can be found in Board Policy B-34

- Workers' Compensation insurance covering all of the Consultant's employees shall be furnished in accordance with the Statutory Requirements of the District and shall include Employer's Liability insurance with a limit of **\$1,000,000** for each accident, for bodily injury or disease.
- Professional Liability or Errors and Omissions = **\$1,000,000** per occurrence / **\$2,000,000** annual aggregate.

10.0 COMPENSATION

The District shall pay the Consultant for services performed and expenses incurred, and compensation shall be paid in accordance with an invoice submitted to District by Consultant within fifteen (15) days from the last day of each calendar month, and District shall pay the acceptable invoice within thirty (30) working days from the date of receipt of the invoice. It is mutually agreed and understood that the obligation of the District is limited by and contingent upon the availability of District funds for reimbursement of Consultant fees. In the event that such funds are not forthcoming for any reason, the District shall immediately notify Consultant in writing, and only services rendered will be paid in full. This Agreement shall be deemed terminated and have no further force and effect immediately upon receipt of District notification by Consultant.

11.0 PRICE INCREASE / DECREASE

No price increases will be permitted during the first year of the agreement. All price decreases will automatically be extended to the District. The District requires bona fide proof of cost increase on contracts prior to any price adjustment. After the first year of the award, a minimum of 30-days advance notice in writing is required to secure such adjustment. No retroactive price adjustments will be considered. The District may enforce, adjust, negotiate or cancel escalating price contracts or take any other action it deems appropriate as it sees fit. The net dollar amount of profit will remain firm during the period of the contract. Adjustments increasing the Consultant's profit will not be allowed. Annual increase shall not exceed the Consumer Price Index – All Consumer, All Items – Los Angeles, Riverside, Orange County Area, and be subjected to satisfactory performance review by the District and approved for budget funding by its Board of Supervisors.

12.0 EVALUATION CRITERIA

Proposals will be evaluated based on relevant factors including, but not limited to, the following:

12.1 Proposals will first be reviewed on a pass/fail basis. Proposals with the following conditions may be rejected as non-responsive, if:

- Proposal is post-marked after the deadline for this RFP.
- Proposal shows an inability to meet the insurance requirements. (Section 9.0, Segment M) and (Exhibit E)

- 12.2 If the Respondents have met both requirements noted above, then the following evaluation criteria will be used for the evaluation and selection of each Respondent. Each proposal will be competitively evaluated on its relative strengths and weaknesses against the following criteria listed below and as described in Section 9.0 of the RFP. The order of the listed criteria is not indicative of their priority, weight or importance:
- Overall responsiveness and general understanding of the RFP requirements
 - Firm's experience and ability
 - Project team
 - References with demonstrated success with similar work to the Scope of Work
 - Technical approach and methodology
 - Financial status
 - Cost proposal
 - Clarification, exceptions or deviations
 - Business Outreach Program Compliance
 - Oral presentations (if required; Refer to Section 13.6)
- 12.3 After a Consultant has been selected by the District, the District and Consultant will negotiate a contract for submission to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and possible approval.
- 12.4.1 The District reserves the right to withdraw the Request for Proposal (RFP), to reject a specific proposal for noncompliance within the RFP provisions, or not award a contract at any time because of unforeseen circumstances or if it is determined to be in the best interest of the District.

13.0 EVALUATION PROCESS

GENERAL

- 13.1 Throughout the entire process of the proposal, Respondent may only contact the Buyer who is administering the proposal. Attempts by the Respondent to contact any other District representative may result in disqualification of the Respondent.
- 13.2 All evaluation material will be considered Confidential and not released by the District. The District reserves the right to split or make the award that is most advantageous to the District.

EVALUATION PROCESS

- 13.3 Proposals will be reviewed by the Buyer to verify compliance with submission instructions, response requirements, and minimum requirements. Any proposals not meeting the minimum requirements may be deemed non-responsive.
- 13.4 Proposal evaluation will commence immediately following the review conducted by the Buyer. During the evaluation process, the Selection Committee may request clarification, as necessary, from Respondent. Respondent should not misconstrue a request for clarification for negotiations. It is anticipated that the evaluation process will be completed within approximately 30-60 working days. Respondents will be notified via email regarding the status of Respondent's proposal.
- 13.5 The District may select qualified Respondent(s) based solely on the submitted proposal(s).
- 13.6 Following the evaluation of the submitted proposals, a short list of the most qualified Respondents may be developed based on the criteria outlined in Section 12. The District may elect to have the short list of Respondents give oral presentations. Short-listed Respondents must be prepared to give their presentation within five (5) business days of the request by the District. The evaluation panel may ask questions about Respondent's written proposal and other issues regarding the scope of work. Presentations will be evaluated, and the District may ask short-listed firms to submit a "best and final" proposal. The short-list interview may be scored. In addition to interviews with the short-list of Respondents, the Selection Committee may also conduct on-site visits and/or tours of the Respondent's place of business.

NEGOTIATIONS

13.7 Negotiations regarding agreement terms, conditions, scope of work and pricing (if applicable) may or may not be conducted with Respondents. Therefore, proposals submitted should contain the Respondents most favorable terms and conditions, since the selection and award may be made without any onsite visit, interviews, or further discussion or negotiations with any Respondents. If the District engages the Respondent in negotiations and satisfactory agreement provisions cannot be reached, then negotiations may be terminated. The District may elect to contact another firm who has submitted a proposal. This sequence may continue until an agreement is reached.

14.0 INTERPRETATION OF RFP

14.1 The Respondent must make careful examination and understand all of the requirements, specifications and conditions stated in the RFP. If any Respondent planning to submit a proposal finds discrepancies in or omissions from the RFP or is in doubt as to the meaning, a written request for interpretation or correction must be given to the District. Any changes to the RFP will be made only by written addendum and may be posted on the District website at www.rcflood.org. The District is not responsible for any other explanations or interpretations.

14.2 All Respondent questions, clarifications or comments must be submitted in writing and must be received by the District no later than February 25, 2025 by 3:30 p.m. Pacific Standard Time. Inquiries received after this date will not be accepted or responded to. Ensure all questions, clarifications or comments are addressed to mcweisen@rivco.org.

14.3 All email correspondence shall be clearly marked in the subject line with "RFP FCARC-00159/Questions." Within the body of the email, each inquiry must reference the section number and title from the RFP that the question pertains to.

15.0 CONTRACTUAL DEVELOPMENT

15.1 Upon selection of the most qualified firm on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications for the type of professional services required, the District will negotiate a price which it determines as fair and reasonable. If the District is unable to negotiate a satisfactory contract with the firm selected, negotiations with that firm will terminate and negotiations with the second ranking Respondent shall commence. A sample of the standard County contract to be used for this project is attached as Exhibit E. The District and the Consultant will negotiate a Contract(s) for submission to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and possible approval.

15.2 Payment by the District for the services will only be made after the services have been performed, an itemized billing statement is submitted in the form specified by the District and approved by the appropriate District representative, which shall specifically set forth the services performed, the name of the person performing such services and the hourly labor charge rate for such person. Payment shall be made on a monthly basis, thirty (30) days after receipt of such billing statement.

16.0 PUBLIC RECORDS

All proposals become the property of the District. All information submitted in the proposal becomes "public record" as defined by the State of California upon completion of the procurement process. If any proprietary information is contained in or attached to the proposal, it must be clearly identified by the Respondent as "TRADE SECRET," "CONFIDENTIAL," or "PROPRIETARY." Otherwise, the Respondent agrees that any and all documents provided may be released to the public after contract award. The District will use its best efforts to inform any proposer of any request for disclosure of any such document. The District shall not in any way be liable or responsible for the disclosure of any such records including, without limitation, those so marked if disclosure is deemed to be required by law or by an order of the Court. The District will not be held responsible for disclosure of any "TRADE SECRET," "CONFIDENTIAL," or "PROPRIETARY" documents that are not contained in envelopes and prominently marked.

17.0 CONFIDENTIALITY AND PROPRIETARY DATE

All materials received relative to this RFP will be kept confidential, until such time an award is made or the RFQ is cancelled, at which time all materials received will be disclosable to the public. Proposals received will be subject to Government Code §7920 et. seq., the California Public Records Act. Respondents should mark information they consider proprietary or confidential in the event it is exempt from the requirements of the Act.

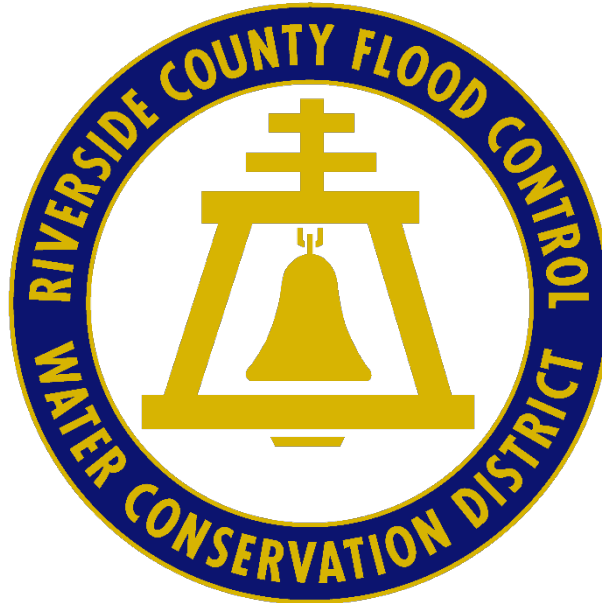

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The Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") dated as of _____ is entered into by and between the (INSERT VENDOR/ CONSULTANT NAME), (INSERT LEGAL CAPACITY), (herein referred to as "CONTRACTOR"), and the RIVERSIDE COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT, a body politic, (herein referred to as "DISTRICT"). CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT are sometimes individually referred to herein as a "Party" and collectively as the "Parties". The Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Description of Services

1.1 CONTRACTOR shall provide all services as outlined and specified in (Exhibit A/Attachment A), Scope of Services, at the prices stated in (Attachment B/Exhibit B), Payment Provisions, to the Agreement.

1.2 CONTRACTOR represents that it has the skills, experience and knowledge necessary to perform under this Agreement, and DISTRICT relies upon this representation. CONTRACTOR shall perform to the satisfaction of DISTRICT and in conformance to and consistent with the highest standards of firms/professionals in the same discipline in the State of California.

1.3 CONTRACTOR affirms this it is fully apprised of all of the work to be performed under this Agreement; and CONTRACTOR agrees it can properly perform this work at the prices stated in Attachment B. CONTRACTOR is not to perform services or provide products outside of the Agreement.

1.4 Acceptance by DISTRICT of CONTRACTOR's performance under this Agreement does not operate as a release of CONTRACTOR's responsibility for full compliance with the terms of this Agreement.

2. Period of Performance

2.1 This Agreement shall be effective upon signature of this Agreement by both parties and continues in effect through (INSERT DATE), unless terminated earlier. CONTRACTOR shall commence performance upon signature of this Agreement by both parties and shall diligently and continuously perform thereafter. The Riverside County Board of Supervisors is the only authority that may obligate the County for a non-cancelable multi-year agreement.

3. Compensation

3.1 DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR for services performed and expenses incurred in accordance with the terms of (Attachment B/Exhibit B), Payment Provisions. Total maximum payments by DISTRICT to CONTRACTOR shall not exceed (INSERT DOLLAR AMOUNT SPELLED OUT) (INSERT DOLLAR AMOUNT) including all expenses. DISTRICT is not responsible for any fees or costs incurred above or beyond the contracted amount and shall have no obligation to purchase any specified amount of services or products. Unless otherwise specifically stated in (Attachment B/Exhibit B), DISTRICT shall not be responsible for payment of any of CONTRACTOR's expenses related to this Agreement.

3.2 No price increases will be permitted during the first year of this Agreement (if applicable). All price decreases (for example, if CONTRACTOR offers lower prices to another governmental entity) will automatically be extended to DISTRICT. DISTRICT requires written proof satisfactory to DISTRICT of cost increases prior to any approved price adjustment. After the first year of the award, a minimum of 30 days advance notice in writing is required to be considered and approved by DISTRICT. No retroactive price adjustments will be considered. Any price increases must be stated in a written amendment to this Agreement. The net dollar amount of profit will remain firm during the period of the Agreement. Annual increases shall not exceed the percentage change for the U.S. Department of Labor Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U); Riverside-San Bernardino-Ontario, CA; All Items, not seasonally adjusted, December 2017=100 reference base, and shall be subject to satisfactory performance review by DISTRICT and approved (if needed) for budget funding by the Board of Supervisors.

3.3 CONTRACTOR shall be paid only in accordance with an invoice submitted to DISTRICT by CONTRACTOR within fifteen (15) days from the last day of each calendar month, and DISTRICT shall pay the invoice within thirty (30) working days from the date of receipt of the invoice. Payment shall be made to CONTRACTOR only after services have been rendered or delivery of materials or products, and

acceptance has been made by DISTRICT. Prepare invoices in duplicate. For this Agreement, send the original and duplicate copies of invoices to:

- a) Each invoice shall contain a minimum of the following information: invoice number and date; remittance address; bill-to and ship-to addresses of ordering department/division; agreement number (**insert contract ID#**); quantities; item descriptions, unit prices, extensions, sales/use tax if applicable, and an invoice total.
- b) Invoices shall be rendered monthly in arrears.

3.4 DISTRICT obligation for payment of this Agreement beyond the current fiscal year end is contingent upon and limited by the availability of DISTRICT funding from which payment can be made, and invoices shall be rendered "monthly" in arrears. In the State of California, Government agencies are not allowed to pay excess interest and late charges, per Government Code, Section 926.10. No legal liability on the part of DISTRICT shall arise for payment beyond June 30 of each calendar year, unless funds are made available for such payment. In the event that such funds are not forthcoming for any reason, DISTRICT shall immediately notify CONTRACTOR in writing; and this Agreement shall be deemed terminated and have no further force and effect.

4. Alteration or Changes to the Agreement

4.1 The Board of Supervisors and DISTRICT's General Manager-Chief Engineer and/or his designee are the only authorized DISTRICT representatives who may at any time, by written order, alter this Agreement. If any such alteration causes an increase or decrease in the cost of or the time required for the performance under this Agreement, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Agreement price or delivery schedule or both, and the Agreement shall be modified by written amendment accordingly.

4.2 Any claim by CONTRACTOR for additional payment related to this Agreement shall be made in writing by CONTRACTOR within 30 days of when CONTRACTOR has or should have notice of any actual or claimed change in the work that results in additional and unanticipated cost to CONTRACTOR. If DISTRICT's General Manager-Chief Engineer decides that the facts provide sufficient justification, he may authorize additional payment to CONTRACTOR pursuant to the claim. Nothing in this section shall excuse CONTRACTOR from proceeding with performance of the Agreement even if there has been a change.

5. Termination

5.1. DISTRICT may terminate this Agreement without cause upon 30 days written notice served upon CONTRACTOR stating the extent and effective date of termination.

5.2 DISTRICT may, upon five (5) days written notice, terminate this Agreement for CONTRACTOR's default if CONTRACTOR refuses or fails to comply with the terms of this Agreement or fails to make progress that may endanger performance and does not immediately cure such failure. In the event of such termination, DISTRICT may proceed with the work in any manner deemed proper by DISTRICT.

5.3 After receipt of the notice of termination, CONTRACTOR shall:

- a) Stop all work under this Agreement on the date specified in the notice of termination; and
- b) Transfer to DISTRICT and deliver in the manner as directed by DISTRICT any materials, reports or other products which, if the Agreement had been completed or continued, would have been required to be furnished to DISTRICT.

5.4 After termination, DISTRICT shall make payment only for CONTRACTOR's performance up to the date of termination in accordance with this Agreement.

5.5 CONTRACTOR's rights under this Agreement shall terminate (except for fees accrued prior to the date of termination) upon dishonesty or a willful or material breach of this Agreement by CONTRACTOR; or in the event of CONTRACTOR's unwillingness or inability for any reason whatsoever to perform the terms of this Agreement. In such event, CONTRACTOR shall not be entitled to any further compensation under this Agreement.

5.6 If the Agreement is federally or state funded, CONTRACTOR cannot be debarred from the System for Award Management (SAM). CONTRACTOR must notify DISTRICT immediately of a debarment. Reference: System for Award Management (SAM) at <https://www.sam.gov> for Central Contractor Registry (CCR), Federal Agency Registration (Fedreg), Online Representations and Certifications Application, and Excluded Parties List System (EPLS)). Excluded Parties Listing System (EPLS) (<http://www.epls.gov>) (Executive Order 12549, 7 CFR Part 3017, 45 CFR Part 76, and 44 CFR Part 17). The System for Award Management (SAM) is the Official U.S. Government system that consolidated the capabilities of CCR/FedReg, ORCA and EPLS.

5.7 The rights and remedies of DISTRICT provided in this section shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or this Agreement.

6. Ownership/Use of Contract Materials and Products

CONTRACTOR agrees that all materials, reports or products in any form, including electronic, created by CONTRACTOR for which CONTRACTOR has been compensated by DISTRICT pursuant to this Agreement shall be the sole property of DISTRICT. The material, reports or products may be used by DISTRICT for any purpose that DISTRICT deems to be appropriate, including, but not limited to, duplication and/or distribution within DISTRICT or to third parties. CONTRACTOR agrees not to release or circulate in whole or part such materials, reports or products without prior written authorization of DISTRICT.

7. Conduct of Contractor

7.1 CONTRACTOR covenants that it presently has no interest, including, but not limited to, other projects or contracts, and shall not acquire any such interest, direct or indirect, which would conflict in any manner or degree with CONTRACTOR's performance under this Agreement. CONTRACTOR further covenants that no person or subcontractor having any such interest shall be employed or retained by CONTRACTOR under this Agreement. CONTRACTOR agrees to inform DISTRICT of all CONTRACTOR's interests, if any, which are or may be perceived as incompatible with DISTRICT's interests.

7.2 CONTRACTOR shall not, under circumstances which could be interpreted as an attempt to influence the recipient in the conduct of his/her duties, accept any gratuity or special favor from individuals or firms with whom CONTRACTOR is doing business or proposing to do business, in accomplishing the work under this Agreement.

7.3 CONTRACTOR or its employees shall not offer gifts, gratuity, favors and entertainment, directly or indirectly, to DISTRICT employees.

8. Inspection of Service; Quality Control/Assurance

8.1 All performance (which includes services, workmanship, materials, supplies and equipment furnished or utilized in the performance of this Agreement) shall be subject to inspection and test by DISTRICT or other regulatory agencies at all times. CONTRACTOR shall provide adequate cooperation to any inspector or other DISTRICT representative to permit him/her to determine CONTRACTOR's conformity with the terms of this Agreement. If any services performed or products provided by CONTRACTOR are not in conformance with the terms of this Agreement, DISTRICT shall have the right to require CONTRACTOR to perform the services or provide the products in conformance with the terms of the Agreement at no additional cost to DISTRICT. When the services to be performed or the products to be provided are of such nature that the difference cannot be corrected, DISTRICT shall have the right to: (1) require CONTRACTOR immediately to take all necessary steps to ensure future performance in conformity with the terms of the Agreement; and/or (2) reduce the Agreement price to reflect the reduced value of the services performed or products provided.

DISTRICT may also terminate this Agreement for default and charge to CONTRACTOR any costs incurred by DISTRICT because of CONTRACTOR's failure to perform.

8.2 CONTRACTOR shall establish adequate procedures for self-monitoring and quality control and assurance to ensure proper performance under this Agreement; and shall permit a DISTRICT representative or other regulatory official to monitor, assess or evaluate CONTRACTOR's performance under this Agreement at any time, upon reasonable notice to CONTRACTOR.

9. Independent Contractor/Employment Eligibility

9.1 CONTRACTOR is, for purposes relating to this Agreement, an independent contractor and shall not be deemed an employee of DISTRICT. It is expressly understood and agreed that CONTRACTOR (including its employees, agents and subcontractors) shall in no event be entitled to any benefits to which DISTRICT employees are entitled, including, but not limited to, overtime, any retirement benefits, worker's compensation benefits, and injury leave or other leave benefits. There shall be no employer-employee relationship between the parties; and CONTRACTOR shall hold DISTRICT harmless from any and all claims that may be made against DISTRICT based upon any contention by a third party that an employer-employee relationship exists by reason of this Agreement. It is further understood and agreed by the parties that CONTRACTOR in the performance of this Agreement is subject to the control or direction of DISTRICT merely as to the results to be accomplished and not as to the means and methods for accomplishing the results.

9.2 CONTRACTOR warrants that it shall make its best effort to fully comply with all federal and state statutes and regulations regarding the employment of aliens and others and to ensure that employees performing work under this Agreement meet the citizenship or alien status requirement set forth in federal statutes and regulations. CONTRACTOR shall obtain from all employees performing work hereunder, all verification and other documentation of employment eligibility status required by federal or state statutes and regulations, including, but not limited to, the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, 8 U.S.C. §1324 et seq., as they currently exist and as they may be hereafter amended. CONTRACTOR shall retain all such documentation for all covered employees for the period prescribed by the law.

9.3 Ineligible Person shall be any individual or entity who: is currently excluded, suspended, debarred or otherwise ineligible to participate in the federal health care programs; or has been convicted of a criminal offense related to the provision of health care items or services and has not been reinstated in the federal health care programs after a period of exclusion, suspension, debarment or ineligibility.

9.4 CONTRACTOR shall screen prospective Covered Individuals prior to hire or engagement. CONTRACTOR shall not hire or engage any Ineligible Person to provide services directly relative to this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall screen all current Covered Individuals within sixty (60) days of execution of this Agreement to ensure that they have not become Ineligible Persons unless CONTRACTOR has performed such screening on same Covered Individuals under a separate agreement with DISTRICT within the past six (6) months. Covered Individuals shall be required to disclose to CONTRACTOR immediately any debarment, exclusion or other event that makes the Covered Individual an Ineligible Person. CONTRACTOR shall notify DISTRICT within five (5) business days after it becomes aware if a Covered Individual providing services directly relative to this Agreement becomes debarred, excluded or otherwise becomes an Ineligible Person.

9.5 CONTRACTOR acknowledges that Ineligible Persons are precluded from providing federal and state funded health care services by contract with DISTRICT in the event that they are currently sanctioned or excluded by a federal or state law enforcement regulatory or licensing agency. If CONTRACTOR becomes aware that a Covered Individual has become an Ineligible Person, CONTRACTOR shall remove such individual from responsibility for or involvement with DISTRICT business operations related to this Agreement.

9.6 CONTRACTOR shall notify DISTRICT within five (5) business days if a Covered Individual or entity is currently excluded, suspended or debarred or is identified as such after being sanction screened. Such individual or entity shall be promptly removed from participating in any activity associated with this Agreement.

10. Subcontract for Work or Services

No contract shall be made by CONTRACTOR with any other party for furnishing any of the work or services under this Agreement without the prior written approval of DISTRICT; but this provision shall not require the approval of contracts of employment between CONTRACTOR and personnel assigned under this Agreement, or for parties named in the proposal and agreed to under this Agreement.

11. Disputes

11.1 The parties shall attempt to resolve any disputes amicably at the working level. If that is not successful, the dispute shall be referred to the senior management of the parties. Any dispute relating to this Agreement, which is not resolved by the parties, shall be decided by DISTRICT's Compliance Contract Officer who shall furnish the decision in writing. The decision of DISTRICT's Compliance Contract Officer shall be final and conclusive unless determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to have been fraudulent, capricious, arbitrary or so grossly erroneous to imply bad faith. CONTRACTOR shall proceed diligently with the performance of this Agreement pending the resolution of a dispute.

11.2 Prior to the filing of any legal action related to this Agreement, the parties shall be obligated to attend a mediation session in Riverside County before a neutral third-party mediator. A second mediation session shall be required if the first session is not successful. The parties shall share the cost of the mediations.

12. Licensing and Permits

CONTRACTOR shall comply with all State or other licensing requirements, including, but not limited to, the provisions of Chapter 9 of Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code. All licensing requirements shall be met at the time proposals are submitted to DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR warrants that it has all necessary permits, approvals, certificates, waivers and exemptions necessary for performance of this Agreement as required by the laws and regulations of the United States, the State of California, the County of Riverside and all other governmental agencies with jurisdiction and shall maintain these throughout the term of this Agreement.

13. Use By Other Political Entities

CONTRACTOR agrees to extend the same pricing, terms and conditions as stated in this Agreement to each and every political entity, special district and related non-profit. It is understood that other entities shall make purchases in their own name, make direct payment and be liable directly to CONTRACTOR; and DISTRICT shall in no way be responsible to CONTRACTOR for other entities' purchases.

14. Non-Discrimination

CONTRACTOR shall not be discriminate in the provision of services, allocation of benefits, accommodation in facilities or employment of personnel on the basis of ethnic group identification, race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status or sex in the performance of this Agreement; and, to the extent they shall be found to be applicable hereto, shall comply with the provisions of the California Fair Employment and Housing Act (Gov. Code 12900 et. seq), the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 (P.L. 88-352), the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §1210 et seq.) and all other applicable laws or regulations.

15. Records and Documents

CONTRACTOR shall make available, upon written request by any duly authorized federal, state or DISTRICT agency, a copy of this Agreement and such books, documents and records as are necessary to certify the nature and extent of CONTRACTOR's costs related to this Agreement. All such books, documents and records shall be maintained by CONTRACTOR for at least five years following termination of this Agreement and be available for audit by DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR shall provide to DISTRICT reports and information related to this Agreement as requested by DISTRICT.

16. Confidentiality

16.1 CONTRACTOR shall not use for personal gain or make other improper use of privileged or confidential information which is acquired in connection with this Agreement. The term "privileged or confidential information" includes but is not limited to: unpublished or sensitive technological or scientific information; medical, personnel or security records; anticipated material requirements or pricing/purchasing actions; DISTRICT information or data which is not subject to public disclosure; DISTRICT operational procedures; and knowledge of selection of contractors, subcontractors or suppliers in advance of official announcement.

16.2 CONTRACTOR shall protect from unauthorized disclosure names and other identifying information concerning persons receiving services pursuant to this Agreement, except for general statistical information not identifying any person. CONTRACTOR shall not use such information for any purpose other than carrying out CONTRACTOR's obligations under this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall promptly transmit to DISTRICT all third-party requests for disclosure of such information. CONTRACTOR shall not disclose, except as otherwise specifically permitted by this Agreement or authorized in advance in writing by DISTRICT, any such information to anyone other than DISTRICT. For purposes of this paragraph, identity shall include, but not be limited to, name, identifying number, symbol or other identifying particulars assigned to the individual, such as finger or voice print or a photograph.

17. Administration/Contract Liaison

DISTRICT's General Manager-Chief Engineer or designee shall administer this Agreement on behalf of DISTRICT and is to serve as the liaison with CONTRACTOR in connection with this Agreement.

18. Notices

All correspondence and notices required or contemplated by this Agreement shall be delivered to the respective parties at the addresses set forth below and are deemed submitted two days after their deposit in the United States mail, postage prepaid:

19. Force Majeure

If either party is unable to comply with any provision of this Agreement due to causes beyond its reasonable control and which could not have been reasonably anticipated, such as acts of God, acts of war, civil disorders or other similar acts, such party shall not be held liable for such failure to comply.

20. EDD Reporting Requirements

In order to comply with child support enforcement requirements of the State of California, DISTRICT may be required to submit a Report of Independent Contractor(s) form **DE 542** to the Employment Development Department. CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish the required data and certifications to DISTRICT within 10 days of notification of award of Agreement when required by the EDD. This data will be transmitted to governmental agencies charged with the establishment and enforcement of child support orders. Failure of CONTRACTOR to timely submit the data and/or certificates required may result in the contract being awarded to another

contractor. In the event a contract has been issued, failure of CONTRACTOR to comply with all federal and state reporting requirements for child support enforcement or to comply with all lawfully served Wage and Earnings Assignments Orders and Notices of Assignment shall constitute a material breach of Agreement. CONTRACTOR should also contact its local Employment Tax Customer Service Office listed in the telephone directory in the State Government section under "Employment Development Department" or access their Internet site at www.edd.ca.gov.

21. Hold Harmless/Indemnification

21.1 To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, CONTRACTOR shall indemnify and hold harmless DISTRICT, County of Riverside, its Agencies, Districts, Special Districts and Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, elected and appointed officials, employees, agents and representatives (individually and collectively hereinafter referred to as Indemnitees) from all liability and any and all Losses that arise out of, pertain to, or relate to, to the extent caused by any alleged or actual negligence, recklessness or willful misconduct constituting professional negligence on the part of CONTRACTOR or its Subconsultants, or their respective directors, officers, partners, employees, agents, representatives or independent contractors, or any person or organization for whom CONTRACTOR is responsible, arising out of or from the performance of services under this Agreement. The Indemnitees shall be entitled to the defense, and indemnification provided for hereunder regardless of whether the Loss is, in part, caused or contributed to by the acts or omissions of an Indemnitee or any other person or entity; provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be construed as obligating CONTRACTOR to indemnify and hold harmless any Indemnitee to the extent not required under the provisions of this section.

21.2 As respects each and every indemnification herein, CONTRACTOR shall defend and pay, at its sole expense, all costs and fees, including, but not limited to, attorney fees, cost of investigation, defense, and settlements or awards against the Indemnitees, any loss, suits, claims, demands, actions or proceedings to the extent and in proportion to the percentage such costs and fees arise out of, pertain to or relate to the negligence, recklessness or willful misconduct of CONTRACTOR arising out of or from the performance of professional design services under this Agreement. The duty to defend applies to any alleged or actual negligence, recklessness or willful misconduct of CONTRACTOR. The cost for defense shall apply whether or not CONTRACTOR is a party to the lawsuit, and shall apply whether or not CONTRACTOR is directly liable to the plaintiffs in the lawsuit. The duty to defend applies even if Indemnitees are alleged or found to be actively negligent, but only in proportion to the percentage of fault or negligence of CONTRACTOR.

21.3 Without affecting the rights of DISTRICT under any other provision of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall not be required to indemnify or hold harmless or provide defense or defense costs to an Indemnitee for a Loss due to that Indemnitee's negligence, recklessness or willful misconduct; provided, however, that such negligence, recklessness or willful misconduct has been determined by agreement of CONTRACTOR and Indemnitee or has been adjudged by the findings of a court of competent jurisdiction.

21.4 With respect to any action or claim subject to indemnification herein by CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR shall, at their sole cost, have the right to use counsel of their own choice and shall have the right to adjust, settle or compromise any such action or claim without the prior consent of DISTRICT; provided, however, that any such adjustment, settlement or compromise in no manner whatsoever limits or circumscribes CONTRACTOR indemnification to Indemnitees as set forth herein.

21.5 CONTRACTOR'S obligation hereunder shall be satisfied when CONTRACTOR has provided to DISTRICT the appropriate form of dismissal relieving DISTRICT from any liability for the action or claim involved.

21.6 The specified insurance limits required in this Agreement shall in no way limit or circumscribe CONTRACTOR's obligations to indemnify and hold harmless the Indemnitees herein from third party claims.

21.7 In the event there is conflict between this clause and California Civil Code Section 2782, this clause shall be interpreted to comply with Civil Code 2782. Such interpretation shall not relieve the CONSULTANT from indemnifying DISTRICT to the fullest extent allowed by law.

21.8 CONTRACTOR agrees to obtain or cause to be obtained executed defense and indemnity agreements with provisions identical to those set forth herein from each and every Subconsultant of every Tier. CONTRACTOR's indemnification obligations under this Agreement shall not be limited by the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable under any policy of insurance, workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts or other employee benefit acts. The Indemnitees shall be entitled to recover their attorneys' fees, costs and expert and consultant costs in pursuing or enforcing their right to defense and/or indemnification under this Agreement.

22. Insurance

22.1 Without limiting or diminishing CONTRACTOR's obligation to indemnify or hold DISTRICT harmless, CONTRACTOR shall procure and maintain or cause to be maintained, at its sole cost and expense, the following insurance coverage's during the term of this Agreement. As respects to the insurance section only, DISTRICT herein refers to the County of Riverside, its Agencies, Districts, Special Districts, and Departments, their respective directors, officers, Board of Supervisors, employees, elected or appointed officials, agents, or representatives as Additional Insureds.

a) Workers' Compensation:

If CONTRACTOR has employees as defined by the State of California, CONTRACTOR shall maintain statutory Workers' Compensation Insurance (Coverage A) as prescribed by the laws of the State of California. Policy shall include Employers' Liability (Coverage B) including Occupational Disease with limits not less than \$1,000,000 per person per accident. The policy shall be endorsed to waive subrogation in favor of The County of Riverside.

b) Commercial General Liability:

Commercial General Liability insurance coverage, including, but not limited to, premises liability, unmodified contractual liability, products and completed operations liability, personal and advertising injury, and cross liability coverage, covering claims which may arise from or out of CONTRACTOR's performance of its obligations hereunder. Policy shall name DISTRICT as Additional Insured. Policy's limit of liability shall not be less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit.

c) Vehicle Liability:

If vehicles or mobile equipment is used in the performance of the obligations under this Agreement, then CONTRACTOR shall maintain liability insurance for all owned, non-owned or hired vehicles so used in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this agreement or be no less than two (2) times the occurrence limit. Policy shall name DISTRICT as Additional Insureds.

d) Professional Liability

CONTRACTOR shall maintain Professional Liability Insurance providing coverage for CONTRACTOR's performance of work included within this Agreement, with a limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate. If CONTRACTOR's Professional Liability Insurance is written on a claims made basis rather than an occurrence basis, such insurance shall continue through the term of this Agreement, and CONTRACTOR shall purchase, at his sole expense, either 1) an Extended Reporting

Endorsement (also, known as Tail Coverage); or 2) Prior Dates Coverage from new insurer with a retroactive date back to the date of, or prior to, the inception of this Agreement; or 3) demonstrate through Certificates of Insurance that CONTRACTOR has Maintained continuous coverage with the same or original insurer. Coverage provided under items; 1), 2) or 3) will continue as long as the law allows.

e) General Insurance Provisions - All lines:

1) Any insurance carrier providing insurance coverage hereunder shall be admitted to the State of California and have an AM BEST rating of not less than A:VIII (A:8) unless such requirements are waived, in writing, by the County Risk Manager. If the County's Risk Manager waives a requirement for a particular insurer, such waiver is only valid for that specific insurer and only for one policy term.

2) CONTRACTOR must declare its insurance self-insured retention for each coverage required herein. If any such self-insured retention exceeds \$500,000 per occurrence, each such retention shall have the prior written consent of the County Risk Manager before the commencement of operations under this Agreement. Upon notification of self-insured retention unacceptable to DISTRICT and at the election of the Country's Risk Manager, CONTRACTOR's carriers shall either; 1) reduce or eliminate such self-insured retention as respects this Agreement with DISTRICT; or 2) procure a bond which guarantees payment of losses and related investigations, claims administration, and defense costs and expenses.

3) CONTRACTOR shall cause CONTRACTOR's insurance carrier(s) to furnish the County of Riverside with either 1) a properly executed original Certificate(s) of Insurance and certified original copies of Endorsements effecting coverage as required herein; and 2) if requested to do so orally or in writing by the County Risk Manager, provide original Certified copies of policies including all Endorsements and all attachments thereto, showing such insurance is in full force and effect. Further, said Certificate(s) and policies of insurance shall contain the covenant of the insurance carrier(s) that thirty (30) days written notice shall be given to the County of Riverside prior to any material modification, cancellation, expiration or reduction in coverage of such insurance. In the event of a material modification, cancellation, expiration or reduction in coverage, this Agreement shall terminate forthwith, unless the County of Riverside receives, prior to such effective date, another properly executed original Certificate of Insurance and original copies of endorsements or certified original policies, including all endorsements and attachments thereto evidencing coverage's set forth herein and the insurance required herein is in full force and effect. CONTRACTOR shall not commence operations until DISTRICT has been furnished original Certificate (s) of Insurance and certified original copies of endorsements and if requested, certified original policies of insurance including all endorsements and any and all other attachments as required in this Section. An individual authorized by the insurance carrier shall sign the original endorsements for each policy and the Certificate of Insurance.

4) It is understood and agreed to by the parties hereto that CONTRACTOR's insurance shall be construed as primary insurance, and DISTRICT's insurance and/or deductibles and/or self-insured retentions or self-insured programs shall not be construed as contributory.

5) If, during the term of this Agreement or any extension thereof, there is a material change in the scope of services; or there is a material change in the equipment to be used in the performance of the scope of work; or the term of this Agreement, including any extensions thereof, exceeds five (5) years, DISTRICT reserves the right to adjust the types of insurance and the monetary limits of liability required under this Agreement, if in the County Risk Manager's reasonable judgment, the amount or type of insurance carried by CONTRACTOR has become inadequate.

- 6) CONTRACTOR shall pass down the insurance obligations contained herein to all tiers of subcontractors working under this Agreement.
- 7) The insurance requirements contained in this Agreement may be met with a program(s) of self-insurance acceptable to DISTRICT.
- 8) CONTRACTOR agrees to notify DISTRICT of any claim by a third party or any incident or event that may give rise to a claim arising from the performance of this Agreement.

23. General

23.1 CONTRACTOR shall not delegate or assign any interest in this Agreement, whether by operation of law or otherwise, without the prior written consent of DISTRICT. Any attempt to delegate or assign any interest herein shall be deemed void and of no force or effect.

23.2 Any waiver by DISTRICT of any breach of any one or more of the terms of this Agreement shall not be construed to be a waiver of any subsequent or other breach of the same or of any other term of this Agreement. Failure on the part of DISTRICT to require exact, full and complete compliance with any terms of this Agreement shall not be construed as in any manner changing the terms or preventing DISTRICT from enforcement of the terms of this Agreement.

23.3 In the event CONTRACTOR receives payment under this Agreement, which is later disallowed by DISTRICT for nonconformance with the terms of the Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall promptly refund the disallowed amount to DISTRICT on request; or at its option, DISTRICT may offset the amount disallowed from any payment due to CONTRACTOR.

23.4 CONTRACTOR shall not provide partial delivery or shipment of services or products unless specifically stated in the Agreement.

23.5 CONTRACTOR shall not provide any services or products subject to any chattel mortgage or under a conditional sales contract or other agreement by which an interest is retained by a third party. CONTRACTOR warrants that it has good title to all materials or products used by CONTRACTOR or provided to DISTRICT pursuant to this Agreement, free from all liens, claims or encumbrances.

23.6 Nothing in this Agreement shall prohibit DISTRICT from acquiring the same type or equivalent equipment, products, materials or services from other sources when deemed by DISTRICT to be in its best interest. DISTRICT reserves the right to purchase more or less than the quantities specified in this Agreement.

23.7 DISTRICT agrees to cooperate with CONTRACTOR in CONTRACTOR's performance under this Agreement, including, if stated in the Agreement, providing CONTRACTOR with reasonable facilities and timely access to DISTRICT data, information and personnel.

23.8 CONTRACTOR shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations. CONTRACTOR will comply with all applicable DISTRICT policies and procedures. In the event that there is a conflict between the various laws or regulations that may apply, CONTRACTOR shall comply with the more restrictive law or regulation.

23.9 CONTRACTOR shall comply with all air pollution control, water pollution, safety and health ordinances, statutes or regulations which apply to performance under this Agreement.

23.10 CONTRACTOR shall comply with all requirements of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards and codes as set forth by the U.S. Department of Labor and the State of California (Cal/OSHA).

23.11 This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Any legal action related to the performance or interpretation of this Agreement shall be filed only in the Superior Court of the State of California located in Riverside, California, and the parties waive any provision of law providing for a change of venue to another location. In the event any provision in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force without being impaired or invalidated in any way.

23.12 This Agreement, including any attachments or exhibits, constitutes the entire Agreement of the parties with respect to its subject matter and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous representations, proposals, discussions and communications, whether oral or in writing. This Agreement may be changed or modified only by a written amendment signed by authorized representatives of both parties.
